City Updates

Website Upgrade - Staff is in the process of upgrading the City's website. While it was anticipated this work would be done in late Spring, COVID-19 slowed down the process

Software Upgrade - The Planning and Community Development Department staff is performing the last training and preparation for the new Building and Permitting software. Transition to the new software will occur in the coming months.

Building Inspections - The Fire Department will begin performing bi-annual building inspections on June 1. Fewer individuals in the buildings and the wearing of masks will assist with adherence to COVID-19 guidelines.

Park and Recreation - Staff is busy preparing for the start of Day Camp on June 15. While social distancing is making many of our normal activities difficult, the staff is working on new and innovative ways to stay connected. Guidelines for youth and adult sports were released last week and are being reviewed by staff.

Olive Crossing - Office Max asbestos abatement is occurring. Roadway plans have been submitted to MODOT. Grading work on site continues.



Ridgehouse - Utilities are disconnected; County has approved final hazardous waste cleanup; Construction plans and application are ready for submittal.



Plant Haven- Application and plans will be on the next Planning Commission Meeting.



Dielman Road Phase 2 - MODOT approved the low bid from Spencer Contracting. The contract will come before the Council on June 9.

Small Business Relief Program

The St. Louis County Small Business Relief ("SBR") Program will provide financial relief to small businesses that were closed during the Stay at Home Order. The grant can be used to pay for the costs of business interruption as a result of the business closing during the Stay at Home Order and to cover costs associated with reopening safely. Business interruption costs could include fixed operating costs during closure. Reopening costs could include acquiring personal protective equipment for employees or customers or installing plastic shields to reduce the risks of transmission between customers and employees.

🕒 May 1, 2020

Small Businesses (<50 employees) are strongly encouraged to apply for the St. Louis County's Small Business Relief Program. Up to \$15,000 to pay for costs associated with business interruption and reopening safely. Deadline to apply is May 31. The City will continue to provide program updates as they become available.
