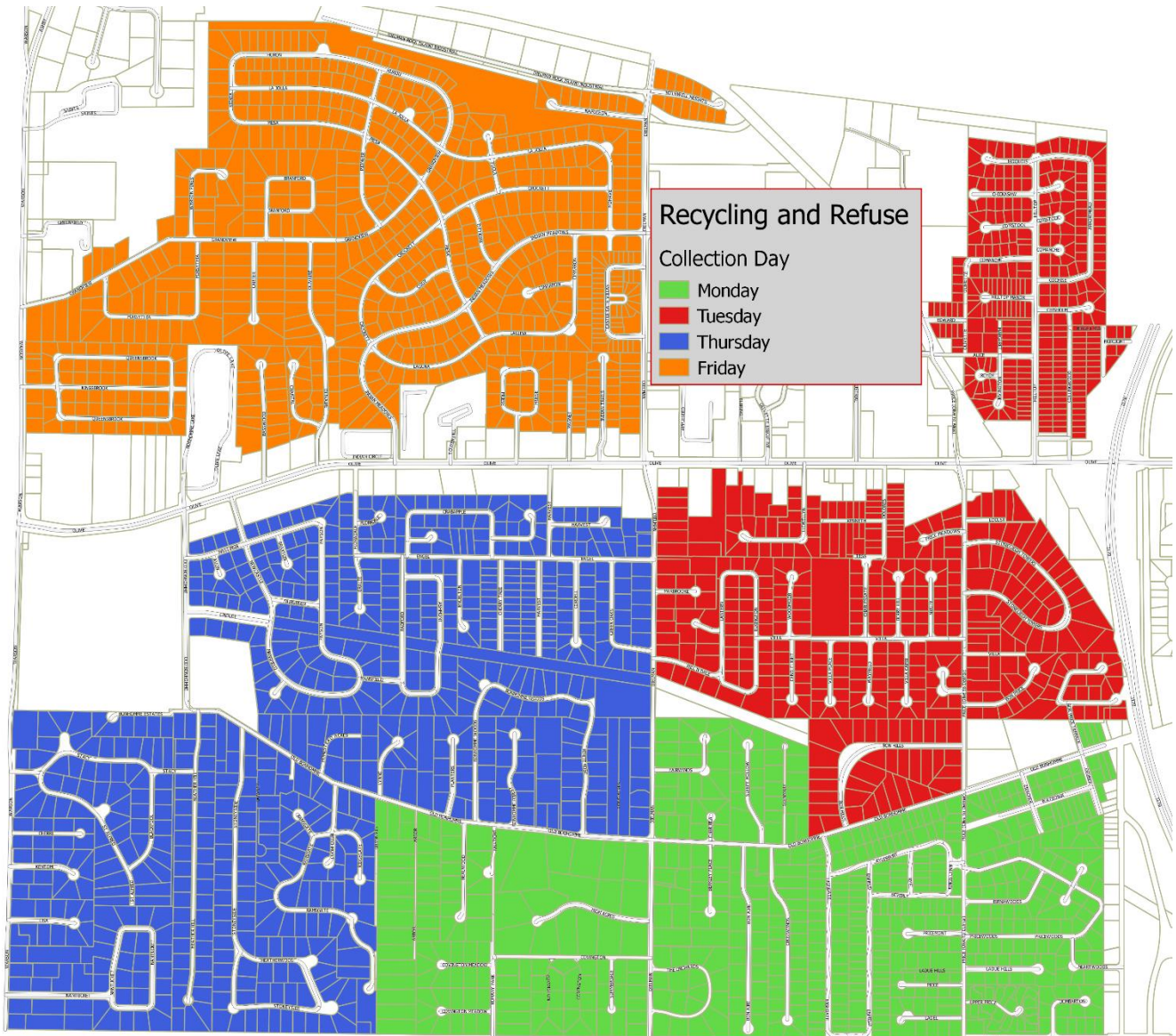


REFUSE CURBSIDE PICK-UP GUIDE

Republic Services is contracted with the City of Olivette to provide waste management services to all of the City's properties. Please contact Republic Services directly at **(636) 947-5959** if you have any questions or comments regarding all trash, recycling, and yard waste.

ALL TRASH, RECYCLING, AND YARD WASTE MUST BE PLACED AT THE CURB BY 7:00AM OF YOUR COLLECTION DAY. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE YARD WASTE OR CARTS AT THE CURB EARLIER THAN THE EVENING BEFORE YOUR PICK UP DAY AND REMOVE THE CONTAINERS FROM THE STREET AFTER COLLECTION. COLLECTION HOURS ARE FROM 7:00AM TO 7:00PM.

****Please note:** Condominium complex dumpsters are emptied Tuesdays and Fridays.



MONDAY

North boundary: The south side (EVEN numbered addresses) of Old Bonhomme Rd. From Stannard Lane (which is south across from Lynne Court) to Dielman; a section North of Old Bonhomme Rd. And East of Dielman, including the EVEN numbered addresses in the 500 block of Dielman, ALL of the 9300 block of Old Bonhomme Rd. (BOTH ODD and EVEN numbered addresses), Char-Bea Lane, Fairwinds Court, Sleepy Hollow Lane and Glenmary Road; the South side (EVEN numbered Addresses) of the 9200 block of Olive Boulevard, and a section North of Old Bonhomme Rd. (BOTH ODD and EVEN numbered addresses).

East Boundary: City Limits

South Boundary: City Limits

TUESDAY

North Boundary: City Limits (excluding area surrounding Rothwell Heights Place)

East Boundary: City Limits

South Boundary: A line running parallel and next to the Northern boundaries of Logos School and Centerton Park (including Bon Price Lane and Bon Price Terrace); a section South of this line including all of Bon Hills Drive; and, a line running diagonally North toward Dielman and including Hill 'n' Dale Drive and Candlelight Lane.

West Boundary: Dielman Road (includes only the East side of Dielman -- EVEN numbered addresses)

WEDNESDAY

City wide yard waste collection see page 7.

THURSDAY

North Boundary: Olive Boulevard from western City Limits to Dielman Road (includes EVEN numbered addresses on the South side of Olive Boulevard ONLY).

East Boundary: Dielman Road to Old Bonhomme Road (including ODD numbered addresses on the West side of Dielman); Old Bonhomme Rd. from Dielman West to Stannard Lane (which is just south of Lynn Ct.) (including the ODD numbered addresses in the 9400 and 9500 blocks on the North side of Old Bonhomme Rd.) and, a line parallel and next to Stannard Lane (includes all housing units accessed via Ramsgate Drive and Stoneyside Lane.

South Boundary: City Limits

West Boundary: City Limits

FRIDAY

North Boundary: City Limits and including Rothwell Heights Place.

East Boundary: All housing units on the West side of Dielman Road from Rothwell Heights Place South to Olive Boulevard (ODD numbered addresses).

South Boundary: All housing units on the North side of Olive Boulevard from Dielman Road West of the City Limits. (ODD numbered addresses)

West Boundary: City Limits

KEY POINTS OF COLLECTION SERVICE

Trash is offered once per week and includes yard waste and recycling. Republic Services provides a 90-gal trash cart, and a 65-gal recycle cart to the residents. Republic Services can deliver, exchange, repair and remove these carts. Additional carts and backdoor service are available at an additional charge to the customer.

HOLIDAY WEEK COLLECITON

On certain holidays your collection day may be offset. Republic Services calls customers in advance of the holiday and you can check [the schedule with their online schedule tool \(click here\)](#)

CART PLACEMNT

TRASH

Trash collection is limited to 90-gallon cart capacity. Additional items placed at the curb will not be collected except on your last collection day of the month when 2 additional bagged items may be placed at the curb for collection.

RECYCLING AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

Recycling is limited to cart capacity which can be upgraded in size free of charge by contacting Republic Services. See page 6 for single stream recycling guidelines. For electronics recycling please visit [e-cycle Missouri](#) for more information.

ANNUAL BULK PICK-UP

Bulk pick-up is 3rd full week of April and there is no limit (some restrictions) on bulk items during the week. See page 5 for more information

CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS ARE NOT INCLUDED

If you have construction materials, please contact Republic Services to have the Route Supervisor give you an estimate for collection. There is a MINIMUM \$50 charge that needs to be prepaid with a debit/credit or payment mailed in prior to scheduling.

APPLIANCES

Appliance collection is limited to 2 items on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The request must be called in at least 24 hours before the collection day and the \$25 pick-up fee per appliance needs to be paid in advance. To schedule your collection please call Republic Services at 636-947-5959.

HANDICAPPED SERVICE

Special consideration for handicapped residents is available for trash and recycle: however, it requires a doctor's note. Republic Services will then pick up trash and recycle from the provided carts at the house, but they must be placed at the front of the house near the driveway visible from the street.

CURBSIDE PLACEMENT AND CART USE INSTRUCTIONS

Place cart one foot from the curb or edge of the street. Garbage should be bagged and tied, then deposited in your cart. This practice will keep your cart cleaner. Please place your cart at least three feet from any tree, pole, fire hydrant, etc. and at least five feet away from any cars parked in the street so the automated arm can reach your cart.



- Do not overload the cart. If the lid is not closed, garbage will be subject to wind and nuisance animals.
- Please do not lean anything against the cart.
- The arrows on the lid of the cart should face toward the street; the handle should face toward your house.
- Your cart should be placed at the curb or edge of the street prior to 7 a.m. the day of collection.
- The emptied cart should be removed from the street the same day.
- The emptying of your cart is guaranteed ONLY if placed for collection on the correct day and time. Republic Services cannot be everywhere at 7 a.m., but they can be anywhere, and that may be in front of your house.
- Yard waste may NOT be placed in trash carts. State law requires that yard waste, which is compostable, not be mixed with garbage.
- Do not put dirt, sod, or rock in the cart.
- Do not put flammable material such as oil, gas, paint, hot ashes, or coals in carts.
- Do not put muriatic acid or other pool chemicals and supplies in carts. These can cause chemical reactions in your cart and in the collection, trucks leading to fires and dangerous toxic fumes.
- Do not put debris from construction, remodeling or demolition in the cart.
- Please do not paint names or addresses on your cart. Each cart is the property of Republic Services and has been embossed with a serial number. If a resident moves from their current address, the cart remains at the residence that matches its serial number in Republic Services' system.
- Your assistance in caring for the cart will help control operational costs and keep expenses to a minimum. We encourage you to rinse the container occasionally with a garden hose and mild detergent. Ammonia cleaners discourage animals. The practice of placing trash in garbage bags, then into your cart, will reduce the frequency of cleaning maintenance.

ANNUAL BULK PICK-UP

The annual bulk pickup is during the third full week of April on your regular collection day.

Appliances are NOT accepted during this collection, see appliance collection procedure below.

All loose items must be bundled and not be longer than 4 feet in length.

Please do not mix yard waste or recycling with trash.

If you have items weighing more than 75lbs or items that will require two people to handle, please call

Republic Services at (636) 947-5959 in advance so they can send appropriate manpower and equipment.

The items you wish to be collected must be placed at the curb by at least 7:00 AM of your designated collection day.

Paint, fuel, oil, tires, construction waste and any hazardous material will NOT be collected.

If you have construction materials, please contact Republic Services to have the Route Supervisor give you an estimate for collection. There is a MINIMUM \$50 charge that needs to be prepaid with a debit/credit or payment mailed in prior to scheduling.

Appliance Collection Procedure

Appliance collection is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. The request must be called in at least 24 hours before the collection day and the \$25 pick-up fee per appliance needs to be paid in advance. To schedule your collection please call at (636) 947-5959.

RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING

ALL RECYCLING MUST BE IN THE CART AND PLACED AT THE CURB BY 7:00AM OF YOUR COLLECTION DAY

The City of Olivette has been a leader in single family residence recycling for many years. As a result of the programs' success, residents can upgrade their recycling bins from 65 gallons to 90 gallons free of charge by calling Republic Services at 636-947-5959.

Materials Accepted:

Aluminum Cans, Trays & Foil (must be cleaned)
Aseptic Packaging & Gable Top Containers

- (cardboard milk & juice cartons)

Steel Cans, Tins and empty aerosols

Glass Bottles and Jars (clear, brown, green):

- NO window glass, dinnerware, ceramics or light bulbs.

Newspaper, including inserts (remove plastic sleeves)

Cardboard (no commercial grade waxed cardboard)

Kraft (brown paper) Bags

Magazines, Catalogs and Telephone Books,

Computer Paper, Notebooks & Gift Wrap Paper

- (no metal clips, spirals, binders)

Chipboard (cereal, cake, food, mix gift boxes etc.)

Carrier Stock (soda & beer can carrying cases)

Mail, Junk Mail & Envelopes

- (no plastic cards, stick on labels or unused stamps)

Paper Back Books (no hard cover books)

Important Guidelines:

- All containers to be emptied and rinsed clean.
- No motor oil, insecticide, herbicide or hazardous chemical containers.
- No Plastic bags – please return to grocery or department store.
- No plastic film (no plastic sheets, tarps or wrap).
- No expanded foam or clear polystyrene per advisory from Region 5 US Environmental Protection Agency.
- Plastics have an identifying code on the bottom of each container.
- Many other product containers can be recycled by utilizing the plastic identifying code.



	Soda, Water, & Flavored Beverage Bottles (#1 clear and green plastic resin)
	Milk & Juice Jugs, Detergent & Fabric Softener Containers (clear and colored plastic resin)
	Narrow Neck Containers such as: health & beauty aid products and household cleaners.
	Grocery Containers such as: margarine tubs, frozen desert cups, six and twelve pack rings.
	Grocery Containers such as: yogurt cups, and narrow neck syrup and ketchup bottles.
	NOT RECYCLABLE – Polystyrene foam food service containers, grocery store meat trays, egg cartons, aspirin bottles, cups, plates and cutlery.
	Plastic Buckets, such as kitty litter containers (5 gallon size maximum)

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

The City of Olivette weekly yard waste collection is designed to dispose of yard waste generated during routine yard maintenance.

Yard waste should be placed at the curb by 7:00AM Wednesday mornings in:

- Paper yard waste bags or,
- 20-35 gallon plastic or metal cans labeled with 'Yard Waste' or an 'X' or,
- Limbs 4 feet or less tied in a bundle that is less than 24 inches in diameter with rope

Any yard waste at the curb that meets the following conditions will **NOT** be collected.

- Limbs greater than 6 inches in diameter
- Bundles tied with wire
- Bundles tied with string that is not strong enough to withstand lifting
- Any container or bundle weighing more than 50 pounds or containing dirt
- Yard waste in: recycling bins, Republic Services provided trash or recycle carts, plastic bags, buckets, wheel barrows, torn bags, cans or bags with limbs sticking out.
